ICU Alumni Association

ICU alumni, students, faculty and staff are eligible for ICU Alumni Association (ICU AA) membership. The Association's primary focus is to strengthen alumni relations, promote the best interests of ICU and cultivate international cultural exchange.

Alumni Association Member

There are three types of AA members. (approximately 25,000 members as of March 2013)

Formal members: College of Liberal Arts or Graduate School graduates

Associate members: ICU students

Special members: Present and former faculty and staff (including part-time)

* Those who did not complete programs in the College of Liberal Arts or Graduate School, One Year Regular students, Kenkyuusei who wish to join the AA will be awarded formal membership upon approval by the Board of Directors and payment of the fee.

* Special members need to request for membership.

Activities

AA Administration (AA=Alumni Association)

General Assembly and Meetings

AA members convene at the annual General Assembly to elect their governing body, be informed of the Association's activities and the treasurer's report, and for budget deliberation and approval. As of 2006, the AA has been offering the Distinguished Alumni of the Year (DAY) Award. A party follows the General Assembly.

* The DAY Award is awarded to AA members, who have contributed to enhancing the popularity or attractiveness of ICU or the Alumni Association.

AA Directors

The governing body of the ICUAA consists of a President, Vice Presidents in charge of AA Sections (up to 10 persons), Directors of the Board (10~30) and Councilors (more than 50).

Board of Directors

The Board of Directors convenes every month excluding August to plan and implement AA activities.

Council

The Council deliberates proposals from the Board on annual plans, budget, amendment of regulations and membership fees to make recommendations to the Board.

* Directors of the Board and Councilors, elected at the General Assembly biennially, serve 2-year terms.

Sections

Directors of the Board and Councilors plan and implement AA activities according to the Section they belong to. Each Section is mainly responsible for affairs indicated below.

University Section (Liaison with the University administration)

Finance Section (Managing AA budget and fund)

Projects Section (Designing AA merchandise, planning and organizing events)

Organization Section (Organizing AA movement, supporting chapter activities)

General Affairs Section (Support overall AA activities, handle IT-related items)

Public Affairs Section (Editing and publishing the AA News and managing the AA Website)

Student Affairs Section (Support for students' extracurricular and job-hunt activities)

Fund Raising Section (Promote fund raising for ICU and AA)

IT Affairs Section (IT Affairs)

ICU Alumni Association Chapters

The Association has approximately 40 domestic and overseas chapters. Alumni volunteer in each chapter to support AA activities in their locality. Information on contacts at each chapter is posted at the AA Website.

Alumni House Lounge (*)

The Alumni House opened on the ICU campus in March 2001. Formal members can use the 50-tsubo (150m²) lounge on the second floor for reunions, lectures, and wedding parties, etc. It accommodates a maximum of 80 for a buffet-style meal. Reservations for alumni reunions and weddings can be made one year prior to the actual date, and six months for other uses.

Lounge: Open 10:00~19:00 on weekdays, Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays
